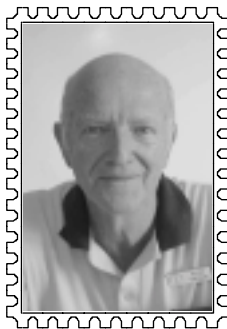

President's Report

I would have thought our Club members were more discerning than to put me back in the chair after an earlier three year stint, complete with presidential ramblings! But I am nevertheless honoured by the decision and believe that, together, we can work towards some very positive changes in the years ahead.



I particularly want to thank Bruce, 2HOT and the other members of the Executive for their unstinting efforts over the past twelve months which have seen some excellent events take place, together with a significant increase in Club membership, due in no small measure to the introduction of the Foundation Licence and the success of the candidates who have been admitted to the "F" troop ranks and beyond since January.

The issue of alternative accommodation looms a little larger with the passing of time and, while there has apparently been no significant movement at the proposed Central Road site for the Emergency Services, we still need to be investigating all available options. I will be presenting, with Executive's approval, a formal approach to Rhema FM suggesting an addition to their existing premises which would meet the needs of our Club and provide Rhema with some much needed extra meeting space as well. In return, the proposed addition would make use of Rhema's existing kitchen and toilet facilities.

While the Rhema site might look attractive, it should not close off other options we might wish to pursue. We need to be mindful of space

requirements for future Field Day activities and other events we might engage in.

I want to make a further approach to Council to determine what alternative sites might be available, both in the Hamilton Green development and elsewhere. We must also determine whether such alternatives are financially attainable, bearing in mind our limited budget. There is also the possibility of other rental sites that should perhaps be considered. Please keep me advised of any suitable locations or sites that you may be aware of around town and we will gladly follow them up.

As reported elsewhere in this issue, some great construction and refurbishment jobs have been undertaken in recent months at the Wednesday morning get-together at Henry's workshop. This is just the sort of activity that a club of this type should be engaged in on a regular basis, giving us something useful to show for time well spent. (*Cont'd Bottom P 7*)

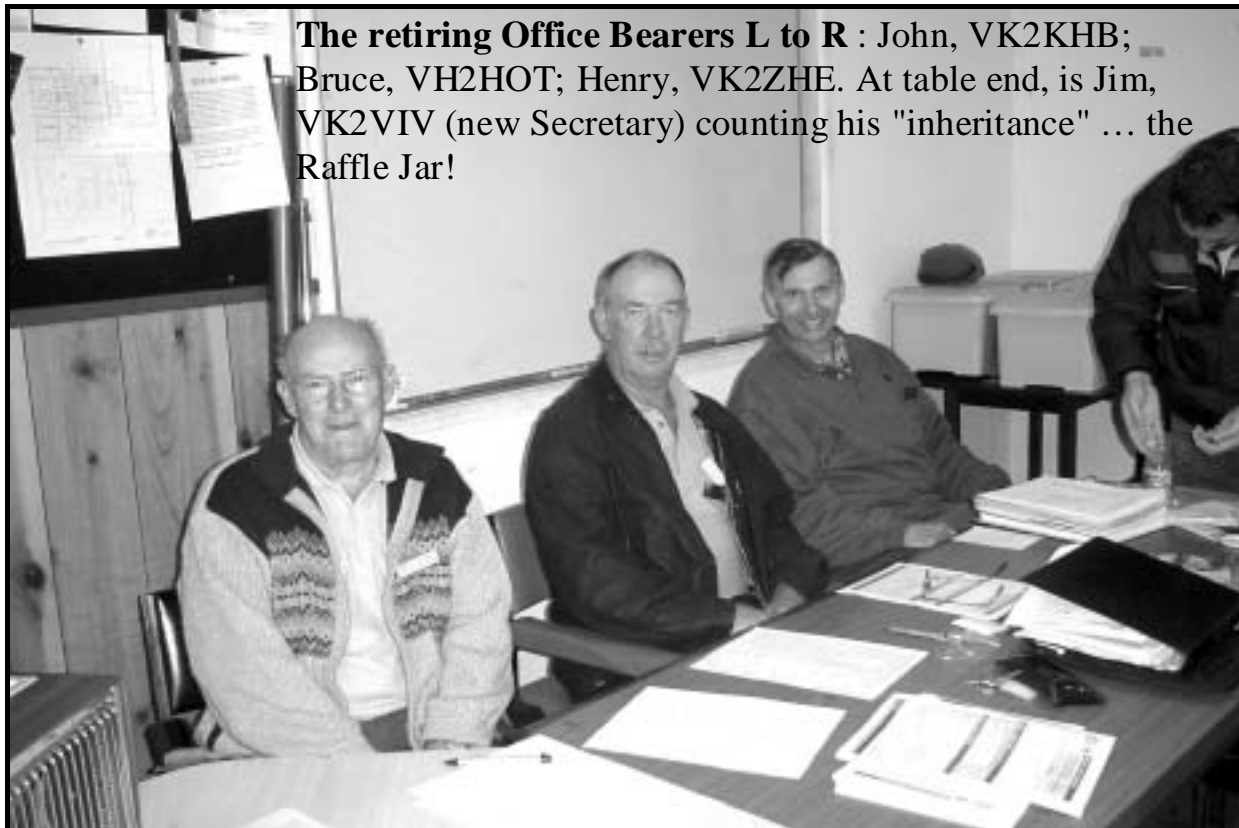
Clubman of the Year

The day of the Car Rally dawned fine and cool. 9am at the club house and equipment loaded up for the Car Rally. A follow the leader style drive out to the rally service point at the Motor Cross bike track.

We were pleased to see fine facilities, including a well appointed canteen. More of that later. With a willing team of workers and Bruce VK2HOT leadership, the Oxley carport quickly took shape.

Once the carport is laid out on the ground it becomes relatively easy to erect. Especially with a large number of club members to help. Les VK2APE, from Morisset had come up to Port with his XYL for the weekend and provided great assistance in taking up a radio check point

and helping with the loading and unloading gear. Bill VK2ZCV found a great spot behind a huge rock for the generator.

Bill gave the basic 'How to refuel' and the ever popular 'Starting the Generator 101' course to Roy VK2YOR and John VK2AYQ. Quick learners and the future of power was assured for the day and evening.

Henry VK2ZHE supervised the set up of the two dual band antennas the club recently purchased. Generator power on, radio's plugged in and VK2BOR was on the air. 147.00 MHz and 146.700 MHz with 70cm all operated without a hitch. Thanks to Bruce's VK2HOT gear we also were able to flick backward and forward



to monitor the Rally CB Net. The Oxley Car Port Headquarters looked most impressive to the extent that many

people kept dropping in assuming that we were the Rally Headquarters!

The deployment of operators to course positions was an interesting exercise in

Radio reports came in thick and fast as the event got underway. Allan VK2GD even providing times to the fraction of a second. We

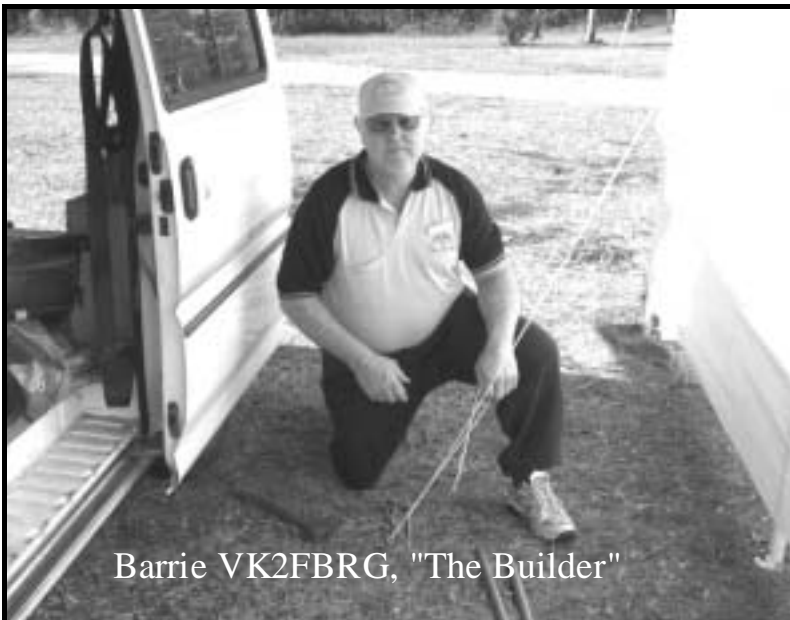
