President's Report

Following a preliminary discussion last week with officers of our local SES unit regarding possible future meeting space and storage facilities in their proposed new premises in Central Road, our Secretary and myself were encouraged by the very cooperative approach taken by Ray and Tim Richards.



Initially it appeared that any storage space might be out of the question but Tim suggested the possibility of four or so of our club members actually joining the SES which would then give our Club full access to all the facilities on the SES site, including trailer storage, when their building is completed next October.

While discussion remains very much in the preliminary stage at this point and our respective Executives have yet to approve the suggestion, we believe it is nevertheless a very positive step in the right direction. We had already considered the possibility of re-establishing a WICEN group within our Club, believing this may be a possible link to the SES but we were also aware that there was reluctance on the part of some of our members to be involved with WICEN.

If some of our Club members were to join the SES, the following positive outcomes for our Club are worth considering:

No costs or fees are involved

We will retain full autonomy and identity

Protective clothing in the form of overalls and T shirts would be provided if and when required

4) No requirement to attend regular training sessions, with participa-tion only in a brief orientation course

5) Availability of storage space for both equipment and trailer with full access

6) Lecture hall availability with full facilities, eg. data projector, DVD player etc.

Local Member Exposed in Rural Press


Local ORARC member, David Harding, VK2AIF, of Wauchope, appeared in the "Wauchope Gazette" on 24th April. David's Curriculum Vitae, together with two pictures, was published in one of a continuing series of articles, "Salute Their Service" compiled by Wauchope RSL subbranch Media Director, Greg Cavanagh.

David's life story makes an interesting and impressive narrative, covering his origin as the son of a WW1 Light Horse Soldier, through his schooling years, early occupations, his service history from 1949 to 1984, his post-military occupation, and finally, retirement.

Beginning his military career in the CMF, and later moving into the Regular Army, he saw service in the 1955 Maitland floods, the Vietnam conflict, in Papua New Guinea attached to the Royal Australian army Medical corps involved in malaria research, and as Staff Officer at Victoria Barracks in Sydney. His movement through his service career took him to the rank of Major.

A paragraph in the media article gave the ORARC some exposure too: "David is still an avid amateur radio operator, being a member of the Oxley Region Amateur Radio Club which covers the Hastings Valley, and spends many hours in contact with like-minded enthusiasts around the world. His call sign, VK2AIF, depicts his long association with the Australian Army."

It was quite fitting that David's "salute" article appeared in the "Wauchope Gazette" on the day prior to ANZAC Day.





A multi-band Rotatable Antenna



I was made aware of this multi-band rotatable dipole after Henry VK2ZHE emailed me a copy of the original article that was published in the Dec 2007 issue of QST by Geoff Haines N1GY.

The article interested me as I had already built a single frequency version of the

antenna featured.

After a fruitless search to procure the octagonal mount that Geoff N1GY used here in VK land, I decided if I wanted one I would have to manufacture it from the ground up.



My version of the Octopus features any 4 of the AR HF bands, I have 80, 40, 20, & 15m installed in the photos, but its easy to drop the array and replace the HF mobile whips with a pair of your choice. I currently also have 17, 12, 10 & 6m whips to fit if I

want to operate on those bands.

The whips known as "Workman" or "Hamsticks" are quite common in the USA, and can be purchased for as little as \$us14.00 each. Those who attended the Wyong Field Days will be shocked as an almost identical type were on sale at a well known purveyors stand of ham equipment. I think they were priced at well over \$80 each! I get quite frustrated and annoyed at such huge profit taking and the way Aussie AR ops are at the mercy of a few greedy suppliers. No wonder "Grey" imports are on the increase!

But I digress.

The actual mount was machined up out of a 3" billet of aluminium, and after the holes were drilled and tapped; 3/8" NF thread for the whips around the edge, the billet was then sliced in two, and separated by 8 mm and then oval shaped pieces of a cutting board (XYL was agreeable and donated me the board!) made up and more holes were drilled and tapped to 6mm in the alloy to allow the two pieces of alloy to be to be sandwiched between the poly pieces to insulate the halves from each other. Then a piece of angle, actually made from a piece of alloy channel was shaped and this then became the mount plus the mount for the SO-239. I used a piece of alloy channel as no angle was available to give me the depth to allow 2 x U bolt mounts.


The Octopus took quite a few hours of machining, as is the case with anything made as a protype. In all, 14 holes had to be drilled and tapped accurately, quite fiddly indeed!

I am still in the process of tuning each frequency, as I found that out of the box, 80 & 20m are perfect, but 40 & 15m need some extra surgery to enable them to operate on the AR frequencies. I have found in the past if a mobile whip resonates too high in frequency a small capacitive hat in the form of a 3" aluminium disc fitted just below the stainless steel section of the whip, this will drop the resonant frequency on 80m about 500KHz.

I have yet to fit and tune the 17, 12, 10 & 6 m whips.

I haven't tried the array on air yet, but because its only 18 feet in the air, I believe it will act like an NVIS antenna, so I do expect on 80 & 40 m long range will be limited. That's my latest attempt at home brewing.

Some Tips for Club Net Procedures

Jim, VK2VIV, has put together the following list of guidelines to assist new operators with some of the generally accepted basic procedures to follow when participating in club nets.

- 1. When invited to sign in by the Net Controller, listen before transmitting to avoid "doubling", then give your call sign to signify your presence, and await instructions.
- 2. Take note who is before you, and, more importantly, who is after you, so that you know to whom to pass it when you have completed your "over".
- 3. Maybe you called in late and do not know the station order. The best approach then is to pass it back to the station controlling the net.
- 4. If you do not know who is the Net Control Station, just use the term "Net Controller".
- 5. If you wish to call in after the net has started, wait till the end of an over and then call in. The Net Controller will advise you who you should follow.
- 6. Whilst there is no need to give call signs on each "over" on normal VHF QSO's, for nets it is customary to give your call sign and the other station's call sign each time you pass it over.
- 7. Keep transmissions shorter than 3 minutes, as the repeater will automatically "time-out" after 3 minutes, and will stay locked-out (inaccessible) for a period.
- 8. Each person will pass to the next in their turn.
- 9. If you don't intend to stay for the next round, indicate this to the net that it will be your last transmission, and sign.
