President's Report

Great to welcome new and would-be "hams" to the area in the persons of Noel, John, Chris and Karen. We trust the Club lives up to your expectations and that you find us a 5 more than friendly mob.



I've decided that it's a very difficult exercise

to write about an event before it actually happens. How can I write about Christmas when it's still ten days away as though it was already over, as it will be by the time this column is read? I trust everyone will have had an extremely happy time with friends and family and discovered that the true spirit of Christmas is alive and well,

despite our gross commercialisation.
All who attended ou who attended our pre-Christmas "bash" at Keith and Gwen's enjoyed themselves immensely, as Henry has ably reported elsewhere in this issue.

This week a number of us liased with our local area RI, Aaron Gosschalk, at the Middle Brother repeater site to try and determine the cause of the trucking interference which has plagued us spasmodically for more than twelve months. With the aid of spectrum analyser, tracking generator and communication test set, Aaron was able to key up the trucking company's transmitter next door on 160.1MHz and immediately up popped a spurious signal smack 146.1MHz measuring 1.1mV at our receiver's aerial terminal! Because of the very large number of signals present on the site, it was not possible to pinpoint the offending "mixing" signal, which could be a local oscillator in one of several adjacent receivers, some of which run 'hot' to minimise frequency drift. This would account for the

lack of another modulation component when the truck signals are breaking through.

A bandpass cavity was then added into our existing chain and Aaron demonstrated conclusively that this would be sufficient to reduce the spurious signal to an insignificant level, leass than TuV. We now have the task of fitting an appropriate cavity of our own and hopefully the days of trucky interference will be over. While on the job, Aaron tweaked up our existing cavities, which were remarkably good, and gained us another 6dB of isolation and around 1dB extra gain in both the Rx and Tx units. He stored plots of our cavities' response curves and will mail a print-out down to us for future reference. All in all, a very successful exercise and our thanks to ACA for their co-operation.

A happy New Year to all our members, associates and families. Let's make it the best one yet for our Club.



On Friday, 14th November, our willing speaker was VK2YOR (Roy Burges). Roy gave us a particularly interesting talk about his lengthy experience during his days in the printing industry. Roy's experience was in the sphere of what has been dubbed "the ink media" in which he worked in a technical/ engineering capacity on the equipment involved in producing prestigious tabloids in Australia and the UK. His service in this competitive area extended from Broadway, Sydney in the 50's to deep within the canyons of Fleet Street, London in later years, spanning 22 years in all. Names like Frank, Rupert, & Kerry were common by-words that arose in the every-day work-place




situations through his interesting career.

Roy experienced the advance of technology in this industry which ranged from the very early post-WWII radio facsimile equipment, the Linotypes, and the increasing complexities that accommodated the demands for faster production and the improvements in colour printing that were met with the development of the computer.

He outlined technical descriptions of the equipment with which he was intimately involved, and related humorous anecdotes from the workplace of his era. It made an enjoyable evening for those who attended, particularly those who would have otherwise, perhaps, been exposed to the usual evening's onslaught from the "goggle-box" commercials, had they stayed at home. Thanks a heap, Roy!

In thanking Roy for his presentation, the President (VK2GD, Alan) included an invitation — read "plea"? — to any other ORARC members who have an informative story or two to relate, to volunteer to tell their story (subject matter not necessarily restricted to Amateur Radio, but of any general technical or human interest topic). 

WIA Welcome to HF QSO Party

On New Year's Day 2004 Australian radio amateurs will gain access to the High Frequency (HF) bands using licences that do not require the passing of Morse code telegraphy tests. To celebrate the occasion, there will be a "WIA Welcome to HF QSO Party". It is going to last 35 hours - starting with the early arrival of New Year's Day down-under at 1300 hours UTC on December the 31st, and concluding at 2400 hours UTC on the 1st of January. The QSO Party is an all mode activity - on all HF bands, with most of the activity expected on 80, 40, 20, 15 and 10 metres. The event aims to welcome VK radio amateurs appearing on HF bands for the first time. (Continued on bottom of P8)
