

**Handy Hint** 

The bottoms of plastic 2-litre milk bottles make ideal storage trays. Simply cut along the top edge of the moulded ridge which runs around the sides of the bottle about 25mm above the bottom. This can be done with either a pair of scissors or a sharp knife. The result is a neat square tray which has smooth corners. Just the thing to hold all the little bits and pieces which you remove when working on your lawn mower or VCR!

D.I.Y. Project Boxes By Trevor (VK2TT)

A relatively inexpensive, yet quite functional and aesthetically pleasing home-brew project box can be produced from the off-cuts of aluminium extrusions. Whilst not in the same ball-park as the home-brew units we saw recently at the ORARC field day weekend (made by John VK2CIF and Mark VK2HMJ) the approach outlined in the pictures (right) is one that could find favour amongst those of us who are less skilled in metal work than John & Mark.

Fig. 1 shows the raw material that was pushed into service at my shack, because it happened to be on hand. Some aluminium "U" channel extrusion (32 x 25mm in this case, with a wall thickness of 3mm), some aluminium box-section extrusion (26 x 26mm, with a wall thickness of 1.5mm) and some flat aluminium strip (20 x 3mm or 12 x 3mm if preferred). All "ruler sizes"!

Fig. 2 shows how the box-section fits snugly into the "U" channel, lending itself to being cut to the required length, and split, to form the end plates of a subsequent

project enclosure.

Fig. 3 shows how the box section is cut (split) with a hacksaw to produce the two end plates of an enclosure.

Fig. 4 shows a set of sides, end plates, and a pair of cover strips cut from the raw stock to form the necessary elements of an enclosure that houses a Home-brew Modem, suitable for both HF and VHF Packet radio operation.

Fig. 5 shows all the elements clamped in a bench vice ready for drilling appropriately aligned and counterbored holes to accept PK screws that will hold the assembly firmly in place.


Fig. 6 shows the counter-boring detail to recess the heads of the Phillips-headed PK screws (Better than using a counter-sink tool for this particular application).


There are no doubt other dimensions of these extrusions that would be available from stockers around the town. They would be suitable for similar improvisation to create larger or smaller utility cases for special projects that are so often required in the shack.

Two of the completed projects shown in the picture below employed cover-strips of 12 mm width because that width was adequate for the housing of the small PC boards involved. The 1200BPS modem did not require cover strips at all, because the "U" channel extrusion was of adequate depth to do the full cover job all by itself.

Try this idea next time you need a special box!












Note for Wilbur: There are invisible "safe Jaws" in each vice. (a 21st century development!)

# Introduction

A number of methods have been devised to facilitate the linking amateur stations via the Internet. One of these systems is called Echolink. At the last club meeting, it was decided to proceed with a three month trial to establish a link to VK2RPM. Echolink was chosen due to the ease of implementation as it requires no special interface cards, the software runs on a standard PC (Personal Computer), and is free.

Echolink was primarily devised and written by Jonathon Taylor, K1RFD, with help from others.

Basically the system works by linking two PCs via the Internet. By connecting a headset to each machine, the operators are able to communicate with each other. Yes, that means communication may take place without a radio being involved. Many QSO's take place in this mode. Depending on the setup of each PC, more than one connection may be established, so a round table (or conference) can be conducted.

If, at either or both PCs, the headset is replaced by a transceiver, then the contact will be transmitted into the local area via the local transceiver. Other local stations may take part in the QSO if it were a normal multistation round table.

# Operation

There are two modes of operation for amateurs in the Port Macquarie area:

# Radio Access

The current operation of the repeater for local contacts will not be affected in any way.

If however, you want to use the additional facilities offered by Echolink, you will need to be able transmit DTMF tones. The currently available

functions and the DTMF codes available are:

Connect to another node: Simply key the node number (See note \* be-

low)

Disconnect: #

Request current status: 08

Connect to a randomly chosen repeater: 01

A number of other functions will be added at a later time.

If you want another station to be able to call you via Echolink, they will need to call node 258920 or, if they are using PC access, (see the operation described in the next section), they will need to connect through VK2CJM-R

\*Note: The node number is a four, five, or six digit code. You can lookup the node number on the Web at:

http://www.echolink.org/logins.jsp

# PC Access

The system requirements are fairly modest. The machine which is providing the access is a 200MHz Pentium with 32Mbytes of RAM. An Internet connection that runs no slower than about 20kbits per second would be sufficient although you would not want to be downloading files or web pages at the same time as using Echolink.

If you want to access VK2RPM via your PC then you will need to:

Download the Echolink software from

http://www.echolink.org

Register your callsign. This registration process may take up to one day. You may even be requested to send a scanned copy of your latest licence renewal for confirmation purposes.

Once you have completed these two steps you can connect to VK2RPM

by looking in the station list for VK2CJM-R.
Conclusion
This is an extremely brief description of Echolink and its implementation on VK2RPM.
The facility will partially fill the void in linked repeaters that exists south of Coffs Harbour and North of Newcastle.
