

Silent Key, John Edward Baylis VK2JB

John's key fell silent on Tuesday morning 21st March 2006 at home in Lake Cathie. He was aged 86. John had a long and fruitful life. Born in the UK in 1919, he saw distinguished military service as a young adult in the 1st British Commando Unit both in Burma and India. John was awarded the Military Cross and was mentioned in dispatches, something he never spoke about. During the Second World War he met Joan his first wife and was married. They were together for 32 years until her tragic death. John later met Mary an Australian Nurse studying in the UK, and was again married for 32 years. John is survived by Mary and his 10 children from two marriages.



John's Army service gave him the confidence and the ability to succeed in business over many years both in the UK and Australia.

John had many interests in life and soccer and Amateur radio were just two, his favourite team was "South Hampton" and he was affectionately dubbed the original Soccer Hooligan by his friends. Amateur radio was also high on his list. John's UK call sign was G3UXX. He described his station to me in the New Forest and told me what he had achieved on VHF and UHF with many DX contacts. On one occasion John was able to talk to astronauts in space. John was also active on HF and boasted about his antennas and copper mine, as he called it. His station was the envy of his fellow amateurs.

When John came to Australia he stayed active on radio and physically, and ran the city to surf in Sydney with some of his children, even after heart bypass surgery. John spent many of his later years in Lake Cathie, south of Port Macquarie. John was a valued member of the Oxley Region Amateur Club. His last outing with the Club was with the John Moyle Field Day on North Brother Moun-

tain just three days before his passing.

John was a valued friend and we met on air as most of us do. I actually met John when I told him that I was making apple pie, his favourite and he had to come and sample it. John became a frequent visitor to our home and always called in on Saturday mornings for coffee and a yarn. We talked about all sorts of things. I never tired of his morning call on 2 metres to tell me the weather, and where the sum was on the tree outside is window. John had a generous nature and he gave back to life and the hobby when he could in return for the pleasure it had given him. I felt privileged, and was one of the few to have seen this side of John.

John's health in later years declined but his zest for life continued and saw him take on some daunting challenges late in life when most would have given

up.

John was very proud that his son Sam took up the Foundation Licence some weeks before he passed on as it was always his greatest wish that one of his children would be interested enough to take up the hobby. Sam's call sign is VK2FSLB.

John's funeral was at the Port Macquarie Crematorium and was well represented by family and friends as well as the representation from the Armed Services and Amateur Radio colleagues.

John will be sadly missed by his family and valued friends.

### **Digital Communications**

(David-VK2AYD)

Digital communications are not new, in fact the first ever wire-less communication was digital. They called it Telegraphy. Then came RTTY and now today there is a multitude of digital communication system in use. The computer has been the major contributor. Just listen on 20 metres between 14.070 and 14.120 and you'll hear the strangest of noises, most of which need a computer to decode them. Over the past 60 years of 'hamming' I've tried quite a few, especially CW! Sixty years ago that was manually created using a pump handle, which I still have.

To-day we have all got computers and most of us have at some time interfaced it with our transceivers. Some of us have dedicated computers

attached to our rigs full time.

Digital communications can be broken into 3 major applications. 1. For transmitting digital pictures. 2. For keyboard-to-keyboard communications and

for audio transmissions.

Pictures transmitted in digital form are excellent, as the sender and receiver are able to hand-shake until a perfect picture is received. Voice, or audio, transmission is somewhat different. Superb if the receiver is receiving a S-9+ signal, which is common on VHF. However on HF it is a different matter as the slightest QRN/QRM/QSB will degrade the signal as there is no hand shaking – it's a one time signal. Last year I acquired a digital modem that just plugs into your TRX Audio-out and Mic-in. Works great on VHF with big signals, but on HF it was hopeless.

However there is one digital system in use today that is really great to use. It's called PSK and can be heard just about any time of day on 14,070

kHz.

You need the computer and a programme called DIGIPAN to receive and send it. If you have any love of the keyboard, you will love this. You don't need high power – 20 watts is sufficient to talk to the world. You will need a very simple interface to isolate the computer in/out from the transceiver. Cost just a few dollars, (2 isolating transformers and a couple of resistors).

DIGIPAN can be down-loaded from the internet or available on the CD that Arthur, VK2ATM, has produced. It is not a big programme, about 650 KB. Using the 'waterfall' principle, it will show you a bandwidth of 4KHz and will receive and display 26 signals simultaneously. Fascinating. You really have to try it to appreciate its capability. Give up VHF, go digital on HF and find a new adventure in Amateur Radio. You'll find local signals from VK2ATM and myself, VK2AYD, on most afternoons when the sun is too hot to work outside (or play golf!). Also lots of very interesting DX. You hear 'em, you can work 'em!

# The View!


As inferred in the report on the day's operations, the weather was not its usual pleasant self. The view to seaward, over the Camdenhaven groin, can be better than this... on a nice day!

#### VALE Keith Lutton - VK2KDL

It is with sadness that we have to report the sudden passing of yet another member of our local Amateur Fraternity, and the ORARC. Keith Lutton, VK2KDL, of Telegraph Point, passed away on 13th April at the Port Macquarie Base Hospital. Although Keith had not been enjoying good health over the previous few weeks, his death was unexpected.

Keith was laid to rest on Monday, 24th April, 2006. The celebration of Keith's life took place at the Innes Gardens Memorial Park Crematorium, Port Macquarie. The service was attended by a large gathering of friends and relatives which included a large representation of ORARC members, and members of the

vintage\_car club.



During the service at the crematorium, Grant Osfield delivered a eulogy that gave many of us a previously unknown view into the many activities that Keith pursued throughout his interesting life.

He was born in 1931 in Haberfield. NSW, and was educated at Sydney Grammar School. By the age of 10 he had developed a strong interest in radio, and at that tender age he was dismantling and reassembling radio receivers.

He met Gwen at dancing classes after completing school, and they were married in 1953. They spent their at a Port honevmoon place called Macquarie!

In his working life, Keith first worked in Kodak's laboratories, later working at Kent Industries in instrumentation and electronics, and progressively moved into television servicing in the Sutherland Shire.

In the 1970's he moved to Lake Cathie, where he established a successful TV repair business. He later moved to

Telegraph point and continued to operate this business from his new home.

Keith had many hobbies, most of which embraced the field of electronics. Dubbed by some as being a "Mad Professor", he was extremely interested in all electro-mechanical, or electronic devices. Very few devices came into Keith's hands without undergoing an in-depth (sometimes invasive) analysis of "what made them tick". Many underwent some form of intricate modification to either enhance their performance, or expand their usefulness to perform functions that had not been envisaged by their original creator.

Grant's summation of "Keith - The Person" truly reflects the qualities we recognised in our highly respected and popular member of ORARC. "He was kind hearted and considerate; a very bright, intelligent and inventive man; always searching for a new or easier way to do something; always had the time to help

his friends out, to fix something, especially when in need."

The members of ORARC extend their deepest sympathy to Keith's XYL, Gwen, and to other family members. We, of the ORARC, share your sad loss. Vale VK2KDL, Keith.
