2006 Field Day Weekend

The 2006 Annual Field Day Weekend was once again a very successful event. The registrations totaled 97 for the two days, which was very close to the predicted number of 100. This attendance, along with magnificent support from 23 generous sponsors, and the crew of willing members who did all the work, made the event one of our most successful ever Field Day weekends.

While the weather on the Saturday was a little unkind as far as field-day weather was concerned (but welcomed by those of us with rural and gardening interests), things were much more field-day-friendly on the Sunday. The fox-hunting was undertaken in excellent sunshine, and calm conditions. Nobody got wet, nor frozen, nor blown over.

The technical demonstrations conducted up-stairs (Digital systems and the like),

attracted plenty of interest. As hoped for, this area and its activities generated much earnest discussion that ranged from the erudite, esoteric, through the light-hearted, right out to the distant extremities of good, old, plain or common-garden boasting. The serious practitioners, the experimenters, the dabblers, and the braggadocios were well represented, and Arthur - VK2ATM, assisted by Bill - VK2ZCV, who handled the demonstration area, heard them all, and both came through it all, totally unscathed and with a yet-higher level of "well-informedness"!

The feeding of the hungry hoards was accomplished with the casual efficiency of the usual "catering corps". 

enjoyed this ORARC event.





Repeater Working Bees

Each week the club's new repeater equipment becomes a little closer to completion thanks to the Wednesday morning working bees at the QTH of Henry VK2ZHE. Club members who are able to assist have been regularly joining the working bees to work on the

repeater equipment.

There are many and varied tasks to be undertaken. A quick snapshot of the 28th of June working bee shows a typical Wednesday morning. At 9am Bill Vk2ZCV, Arthur VK2ATM and Neil VK2EI brought Henry VK2ZHE sprinting to open the shed door. A short while later Neil VK2EI began the first of many saw strokes to cut a 50 millimetre length of heatsink for the spare power supply for the VK2RCN digipeater. At the same time Bill VK2ZCV and Arthur VK2ATM began testing the 438.425 MHz UHF transmitter. By 10.30am Neil had produced a professionally cut and deburred heatsink and Bill and Arthur declared the UHF transmitter serviceable on its original frequency. After a well earned morning tea break Bill and Arthur retuned the UHF transmitter to the VK2RCN repeater frequency of 438.425MHz and Neil drilled and mounted the heatsink on the power supply and fitted a new mains switch to the supply which then passed its preliminary smoke test. At 12.30pm Henry closed the shed door as the workers departed for the day.

Regulars at the working bees include VK2ZCV, VK2ZATM, VK2ZCW, VK2EI, VK2ZCM, VK2KHB, VK2BZD and VK2AYQ with VK2HOT calling in as work permits.

Henry VK2ZHE provides the bench space and endeavours to keep the workers supplied

with everything from a CRO to a 10pF NPO disc ceramic capacitor.

There are still many Wednesday mornings required in order to complete the new VHF and UHF repeaters but great progress is being made. The working bees are additional to the repeater site visits and work which various members have been undertaking at home. Please contact Repeater Officer Bill Brooke VK2ZCW if you would like to help.
