### FOX HUNT RULES:

# OXLEY REGION AMATEUR RADIO CLUB:

- 1: All fox-hunters MUST register with the official STARTER before the events and must read and carry these rules.
- 2: Each vehicle must have only <u>ONE</u> official competitor/driver and only <u>ONE</u> official navigator/observer. However, competitors are encouraged to take up to <u>TWO</u> passengers who have had <u>NO</u> previous experience in fox-hunting, with a view to creating interest in this activity.
- 3: <u>ALL</u> transmitters are within the local town map boundary. Maps are available at the Secretary's table in the building of the day. Sniffers may be required.
- 4: All transmitters are placed so that access to or through <u>PRIVATE</u>

  <u>PROPERTY</u> is not necessary. Disqualification will result if this rule is not observed.
- 5: Elapsed time will be allocated to each event; as nominated by the STARTER and will be strictly adhered to. The fox will switch transmitters OFF right to the second. (Fox will be in two-way contact with the starter via repeater.)
- 6: Excessive speed or dangerous driving means <u>AUTOMATIC</u> disqualification. Let that be very clear! Please observe rules of the road and speed restriction signs.
- 7: Grass and gravel in the start area is soft and loose. No clutch or wheel spin starts, please. Kindly take it easy...remember our public image.
- 8: POINTS SCORING FOR THE TWO TRANSMITTER EVENTS:
  Note: One transmitter is designated as the more difficult of the two;
  therefore it carries two (2) extra points:

First Place: (Hardest Transmitter) = 12 points:

First Place: (Easiest Transmitter) = 10 points:

Second Places: = 8 points:

Third Places: = 6 points:

Fourth Places: = 4 points:

After this, you can still earn two (2) points by being a finisher, who finds the transmitter, removes another place card and hands it to the starter.

Note: The Foxhunt Championship for the Oxtales Cup, has a different points score system. (see Event 24 on the official programme)

9: Where applicable, place cards are with each transmitter. It is the responsibility of the competitor to pick up the card with the <u>LOWEST</u> sequential number. No debates or corrections allowed after the event.

### FOX HUNT RULES (Continued)

## OXLEY REGION AMATEUR RADIO CLUB;

### 10: TALK-IN EVENT: (Note Rule 6)

- \* Listen carefully to the questions and answers:
- \* Use your powers of deductive reasoning: ASK
- \* The "FOX" will only answer "YES" or "NO" but may the questioner for clarification if the question is capable of drawing an ambiguous answer.
- \* All contact will be via the Repeater Ch.2...i.e 146.700:
- \* In the unlike event of Repeater failure, the <u>FOX</u> will use Channel 50 (146.500) simplex.
- \* Please WATCH OUT FOR REPEATER TIME-OUT!...let repeater drop out:
- \* Talk-In will be conducted within the limits of the town map.
- 11: Competitors, navigators, observers and passengers enter each and every event at their own respective risk entirely. All insurances are the personal responsibility of all and each of those persons so mentioned and no claim or claims for any damages or any injury will be entertained or accepted by the Oxley Region Amateur Radio Club as a committee or by any member or members of that club. Let this rule be clearly understood and accepted <a href="mailto:BEFORE">BEFORE</a> entering any or each event.

#### 12: AWARDS:

One first prize will be allocated for each fox hunt event. One runner-up prize will be allocated for each of the two (2) transmitter events.

#### FOX HUNT CHAMPIONSHIP:

The "OXTALES CUP" trophy will be awarded to the Foxhunt Championship winner. It is a perpetual trophy which will be suitably engraved each year and retained by the Club. A suitable replica will be given to the winner. In the event of a tie, a countback pointscore system will apply by using the pointscore system detailed in these rules for the two (2) transmitter events; last event used first. Championship points will be awarded for each of the four (4) main foxhunt events held on Saturday and Sunday; allocated as follws:

First = 10: Second = 8: Third = 6: Fourth = 4: After that, each starter who finishes = 2:


