Pictured below, is the Late W6POU (Bob) and as the caption said;" <u>Lest we forget</u>, here's Bob - hard at work at a Field Day past".








Inside wasn't much better. Surplus gear is like a giant magnet to every Ham! The surplus gear sale for 1986 looks like being bigger than ever!



A Rollands Plains amateur radio operator has won an Australia wide Morse Code contest.

Mr Peter Alexander won the Federal Presidents Cup after scoring 16,088 points with a total of 247 different contacts being made.


This is the first occasion that the prestigious trophy has been won by a member of the Oxley Region Amateur Radio Club.

The award was accepted on behalf of Mr Alexander by the Federal Councillor of the Wireless Institute of Australia, Mr Stephen Pall at the Federal Convention of the Institute which was held in March.

Mr Alexander is to receive his replica of the trophy at a field weekend to be held in Port Macquarie on June 8 and

The Divisional President of the Institute, Mr Peter Jeremy will be presenting the trophy.

The original of the President's Cup is kept under lock and key at the Parramatta headquarters until next year when the cup will be returned to Melbourne for the presentation to the 1986 winner.

Congratulations Allan! Trust that yor dad VK2KHD (Merv) has better fortune at next exam for upgrading. He's good at CW too!




