
As discussed at the A.G.M., our Friday night meetings will be reduced to twice per month, commencing in March. As from March, the Friday meetings will be

Dear Minister,

I have been directed by the 60 members of the Oxley Region Amateur Radio Club Inc., to write you in protest to the recent proposal by the Spectrum Management Agency to increase the cost of an Amateur Radio Transmitting Licence from \$36 to 69\$ per annum. (An increase of 92%).

The High Frequency spectrum used by Radio amateurs is world wide and controlled by the International Telecommunication Union and not governed by Australia, although we do have membership of this Union.

Radio Amateurs are the only users of the H. F. spectrum that are required to pass academic examinations before being granted a licence. Trucking companies, business, even Citizen Band operators are not required to have any qualifications, yet in Australia, as in many other countries CB operators are given freedom of the spectrum with no licence and no fee.

In many countries Amateur Transmitting Licences are free. For example in the USA it is issued by the Federal Communications Commission, free for a period of ten years (renewable) subject to proof of passing the academic examinations.

We ask, why we, as qualified radio operators in Australia, are subjected to this embarrassing charge per year. (It becomes embarrassing when discussed with overseas amateurs, such as the USA, that we are charged to research and develop radio systems for the future good of the country).

Must we construe that this is a deliberate Tax against the 18,000 Radio Amateurs in Australia? If it is not a tax then why can't a licence be issued free, subject to qualifications, (or for a small charge, bearing in mind it costs as much to issue a one year licence as it does for ten years).

It is imperative that Radio Amateurs know whether this is a deliberate federal tax as it will naturally have some mark of concern at the next general election.

We await with interest for your reply.

A Novice Theory Course was conducted throughout 1994 at Wauchope High School on Thursday evenings. Four students started the course but only two completed it. owing to a lack of interest, no more classes were conducted last year.

This year we are starting out in Mid-February with a few sessions on regulations culminating in an exam in March or April. Following this, we will try

to get a morse class running if enough candidates can be mustered.


While we advertised our classes widely last year in the local press and on local radio stations, no students were attracted by these methods. It would seem that there is currently a dearth of potential amateurs, at least in the Hastings.

A further inhibiting factor is the WIA's policy with respect pricing examinations. A candidate attempting one theory exam, regulations and morse sending and receiving is charged \$50 for examination material on top of which the Club has to make a charge for return postage. Moreover, given the extreme variability in difficulty among the examination papers seen recently, and the obscure nature of some of the questions asked, many well-prepared candidates fail on the first attempt. Consequently a total cost averaging \$100 is not uncommon for candidates attempting examinations.

Theory classes will only run this year if at least five starters can be found. The normal attrition rate of 50% or more makes it pointless to start with fewer. Candidates wishing to attempt full call theory can obtain course material including videos; through the club to study at home.

Examinations are usually conducted on demand and can be organised in about two weeks. In closing, I wish to thank Trevor VK2TT and Bill VK2WST for their assistance in running examinations during the past year.


