Secretarial Thoughts de VK2AYD

Have you ever wondered where Amateur Radio will be a decade from now? I've watched it progress over the past 50 years from when we were pioneers and built everything ourselves to the present day where we are just appliance operators.

I'm sure a decade from now telegraphy will no longer be mandatory, but what of technology? Last month I was reading all about COHERENT CW, which only requires a bandwidth of 10 Hz (yes 10 c/s) which means that 100 stations could occupy a bandwidth of one kilohertz.

It is currently being experimented with by Amateurs using telegraphy and operating .035 KHz up on most bands. As yet I haven't heard it, but then my trusty TS-930S isn't really capable of reducing its passband to such fine limits. Will analogue voice transmissions be replaced by digital voice transmissions on HF and what will this entail? Already with voice digital voice compression exceeding the levels required, soon we will have code-excited linear predictive (CELP) speech coders. Will Packet radio be transmitted on VHF at speeds greater than 9600 bd?

What are your thoughts on the future technology we shall expect to see?

Telephone RFI

Ian Dalrymple reports that many hams know that the Telecom Touch Phone 2000 is prone to RFI. What very few know, however, is that a cure is available. For some reason, Telecom is rather secretive about it.

A touch Phone replacement is available which has been modified to cure the RFI problem (Item No. 227, Serial No. S550). Your local Telecom representative may not know about them but they definitely are available.

Ian suggests you tell your neighbours if they have complained about your transmissions coming through the phone.

FLUKE DMM WARNING!!

Appearing on the packet BBS's during the month of August, was a warning regarding a safety hazard in the Fluke Series II, Models 21, 23, Kit 23, 70, 73, 75, and 77, digital multimeters bearing serial numbers between 60990000 and 63752000. (If the S/N of your DMM is preceded by a "9" or followed by an "R", this warning does not apply.

The manufacturers have released an operational safety notice which explains as follows:-

WHEN THE MALFUNCTION OCCURS, THE METER MAY NOT INDICATE THAT HIGH VOLTAGE IS PRESENT, PLACING THE USER IN A POTENTIALLY HAZARDOUS SITUATION.

The malfunction may occur when a voltage input greater than 400 Vdc is applied in either voltage functions, AC or DC. The meter may go into a lock-up state and will indicate a reading of (or near) zero volts.

The failure mode commonly occurs when the positive lead (red) is connected first to a high voltage supply and then the common (black) lead is connected.

To correct this problem, Fluke will modify your meter without charge. Even if you normally do not use your meter in the voltage range mentioned, it is recommended that you return your meter to you nearest Fluke service centre.
