It was noted during the field day on 9th June, that all has not been standing still at the Sea Scout's Hall In Buller Street. Paul Romaine (VK2UPR) with some help, from time, from other club time to members, Ian (VK2XU), Bruce (VK2HOT), Col (VK2GMD), and John (VK2VY), have undertaken some very worthwhile projects to assist the Sea Scouts. The team has provided the local scouting group with some radio facilities to assist in the rapid setting up of a JOTA station, or other special event station, at the Scout Hall.

VHF antenna installations are now a permanent fixture, comprising a 10-element Yagi, and a Slim Jim for 2-Meter use plus a 2-Meter 5/8th (mobile). For HF operation, a Cushcraft Multiband antenna has been installed. These antennae were donated by Paul to the Sea Scouts.

A 2-Meter transceiver, donated by Arthur (VK2ATM), has been installed as part of the facilities. Another donation from Peter (VK2BZA) is awaiting collection and installation in due course.

The Sea Scouts have lodged an application for a club call sign, and pending a successful outcome, Ian (VK2XU) is performing the role of the "full call custodian".

Paul has asked that we relay his plea to the membership at large, for donations of time or unused equipment that could go towards what he describes as a future "smorgasbord" of communications media he has in mind for the Sea Scout's headquarters.


